FROM OUR PRESIDENT

My annual report to be presented to the AGM on Sunday 27 November contains details of the striking renovations to the interior of the museum/cafe building that are currently underway. Therefore rather than repeat myself, I refer you to that report or better still call in and see for yourself. What a transformation! Final costings are not yet available as some work is still in progress.

Now talking about 'calling in', I am amazed at the number of people (including locals and descendants) who have not visited New Italy for quite some years. No doubt your experience is the same. Now here is your opportunity! Why not suggest a visit to the New Italy Museum Complex to see all the wonderful transformations that are happening. We would appreciate yours and others feedback! It is always encouraging for us to know that our efforts are finding traction as New Italy becomes not only a stop off point for long distance travellers but also a meeting place for locals. With Christmas coming, why not do some shopping in our ever-improving gift shop - see inside for some excellent gift ideas!

Visitors to the district will see that serious earthworks have started on the Pacific Highway upgrade. This upgrade will mean that in about three years the towns of Woodburn, Broadwater and Wardell will be completely bypassed while (as you know) our site will not. Since we will then be in a "last-man-standing-situation" it is logical to anticipate a considerable increase or a healthy growth rate in visitor numbers. Therefore our next renovation focus (after the museum/cafe upgrade is completed) will be improving vehicle parking facilities. To do this we are in discussions with the RMS

regarding their building of a temporary parking facility to the west of the site (in the pine forest) while the existing one at the front of the site is demolished and then rebuilt to a higher standard. Then when the new front parking is complete we will also have use of the temporary parking facility – which will be upgraded to an acceptable standard. These expanded facilities will give us the opportunity to both cater for more short stops and to increase the number of overnight stays by caravans. At this point in time, this work is expected to commence in about 18 months.

Last but certainly not least, in order to continue to grow and improve, we need more volunteers! We are desperately short of willing hands to assist in the gift shop and/or museum and pavilion. The work is light, the socialising is fun and the results satisfying. What a difference a few more people would make! If interested in helping in the shop please call Gail on 0414 348 566. NEW ITALY MUSEUM UPGRADE - SO FAR...

To facilitate the New Italy Museum upgrade, all the displayed items, photographs and the family cabinets have been removed from the museum display area.

The items are temporarily housed in the community hall where they are being cleaned, photographed, and entered into our "Collection Mosaics" data base program

The museum ceilings and walls have been lined, the floor repaired, with all surfaces being sealed and painted. With the addition of track lighting, we now have a vibrant, bright, display area to work with.

The museum working group are designing and planning the new displays that will be arranged around the walls so they tell the story of New Italy as you walk around the museum.

In this *Il Giornale*, you can see the process so far. We aim to keep the style and atmosphere of the New Italy settler community, working closely with a range of sources, descendants and community members, the Heritage Council, architect Heike Seubert with builders Jimmy Barnes and Pete Robinson.
